

Employment: - Number of created Jobs in month of December 2013

A total number of 401 jobs were created in the month of December 2013, the term "created" is limited to advertised jobs in formal press such as all published newspapers and job internet sites casting jobs in Rwanda. These included temporary and permanent jobs as is explained below.

In terms of sectors, there are 21 economic sectors (ISIC 08), most of the jobs were created in Education, Public administration, Health services, Information and communication, Financial and insurance activities, respectively, whereas the least number of jobs were created in Electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply, and Construction, for details, see table below.

Permanent Jobs

363 permanent jobs were created in the month of December, with public sector accounting for 67.2%, while the professionals were the most demanded for skilled labour units with a proportion of 63.4%, For details see tables (Table4) and (Table2) below.

Temporary Jobs/Consultancy Jobs

A total of 38 temporary/ consultancy jobs were created in December with the public sector generating 36.8% of the jobs, private sector 18.4%, parastatal institutions 0% while NGOs 44.7%. Most of the created jobs required professionals in the respective areas.
