

Employment: - Number of created Jobs in month of September 2013

A total number of 603 jobs were created in the month of September 2013, the term “created” is limited to advertised jobs in formal press such as all published newspapers and job internet sites casting jobs in Rwanda. These included temporary and permanent jobs as is explained below.

In terms of sectors, there are 21 economic sectors (ISIC 08), most of the jobs were created in the Public administration, Professional, Scientific and Technical services, Education and Health services respectively, whereas the least number of jobs were created in Arts, entertainment and recreation, and real estate activities, for details, see table below.

NB: Other services means According to the ISIC classification, this is a main economic activity among 21 activities which includes the following sub activities: Washing and (dry Cleaning of textile and fur product), Hairdressing and other beauty treatment, Funeral and related activities.

Permanent Jobs

526 permanent jobs were created in the month of September, with public sector accounting for 74.1%, while the professionals were the most demanded for skilled labour units with a proportion of 64.8%, for details see tables (Table4) and (Table2) below.

Temporary Jobs/Consultancy Jobs

A total of 124 temporary/ consultancy jobs were created in September with the public sector generating 79.1% of the jobs, private sector 2.3%, parastatal institutions 11.6% while NGOs 7%. All the created jobs required professionals with most requiring master's degrees in the respective areas.
